## **Artist Statement**

Langkah in the Indonesian language means move or movement as physical or mind. I chose Langkah as the title of my solo exhibition to express my emotional intimacy with my mother language. Langkah/melangkah/step away/move intrigues me to examine myself and life, meaning and purpose, leaving and forming.

Langkah art exhibition represents my art visual journey from the beginning to the present. I valued my artwork and the process as a cue to inspire my new journey, in life and art. I believe that art and life are inseparable things. They are the impulses that need to be expressed, liberated and embraced. The artworks express eagerness for honesty about human feelings, emotions and ideas. My unique perspective is illustrated through the vibrant colours, spontaneous lines, and bold brush strokes. I chose oil as a medium to portray the fluidity of life and feelings. My paintings are truthful of life moments, unspoken feelings and thoughts and unmask buried emotions.

## **Curator Statement**

Manaia-based artist Krismarlianti presents Langkah (Steps) a solo exhibition charting the development of her visual arts practice over the past decade. Born in Indonesia, the artist grew up in West Java and was significantly affected by the early death of her father in her mid-teens. The loss of the soulmate who encouraged respect for humanity and to follow one's dreams had profound emotional consequences until art later intervened. While attending university in Yogyakarta, the turning point was an introduction to the performing arts – acting and writing. Krismarlianti thrived emotionally and emerged from the shadow of family tragedy and is best known for her writing in Indonesia. For a time, corporate work and postgraduate study in Jakarta summoned but fashion and design soon grabbed her attention. The artist's serious interest in visual arts really kicked off in 2016 when she made the leap from fashion illustrator to surrealist acrylic on canvas painter and in due course abstract expressionist painter. Langkah (Steps) communicates the artist's ideas, deepest feelings and emotions unchained and made clear through a vibrant primary colour palette and auxiliary use of pastels since moving to Aotearoa in 2021.
